We have had a busy week in Year 3! We worked really hard on Monday to finish our explanation texts about water cycles before starting a new writing topic that involves writing motivational speeches for sports stars.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed comparing and analysing different motivational speeches and have really impressed Miss Evans with their understanding of complex vocabulary. In maths we have been practically adding money by designing and creating our own shops with addition money problems for our customers.
