In literacy this week we have started to re-tell the traditional tale of the “Three Billy Goats Guff”. Imitating and repeating the same text daily enables children to learn the structure of the text which in turn helps them to retell it. Next week some children will have a go at writing the story starting with “Once upon a time...” and using key features from the text. I’m looking forward to sharing their work with you. The children were also challenged to build bridges out of anything they can find in the classroom and have been impressed with the structures they’ve produced using lego, card and the large blocks.

We have re-visited the vocab of money while buying our snacks from Mrs Robinson and through role play in a rather unique “space (capacity), shape and measure” shop. In Forest schools we performed a “worm dance” to persuade worms to the surface and were excited to find it worked! We now have our own class wormery to observe.
